19	(B) includes any air crew member of fixed-
20	wing aircraft and personnel supporting genera-
21	tion of the aircraft, including pilots, navigators,
22	weapons systems operators, aircraft system op-
23	erators, personnel associated with aircraft
24	maintenance, supply, logistics, fuels, or trans-
25	portation, and any other crew member who reg-

ularly flies in an aircraft or is required to com-1

2 plete the mission of the aircraft.
