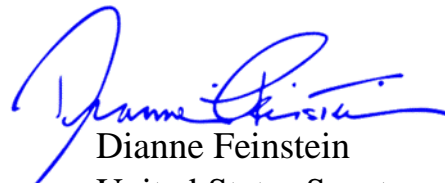

Imperial Valley College	Funds would be used to establish a lithium workforce training initiative at Imperial Valley College, a community college located near the Salton Sea. Due to the growth in lithium development, the college is creating three new programs that will provide industry training in laboratory systems, hazardous materials, water treatment and other industry-related areas.	Imperial CA	\$1,000
City of Imperial	Funds would allow the City of Imperial to partner with local developers and landlords to afford prospective entrepreneurs an opportunity to test their restaurant concepts. The city hopes to create five to eight successful incubators within the community.	Imperial CA	\$850
City of Long Beach	Funds would be used to purchase and renovate a facility to house the Long Beach Accelerator in downtown Long Beach. The business accelerator is a partnership between the City of Long Beach, Long Beach State University, and the Sunstone Private Equity Fund to assist local entrepreneurs with funds to start businesses, with a goal of growing the tech industry in the region. Accelerators provide investment opportunities, office space, and technical resources to companies.	Long Beach CA	\$1,000
