County of Inyo, California	The requested funding would go towards an "Eastern Sierra Business Center" on Main Street in Bishop, CA. Funding would go towards the purchase of broadband, furniture, and equipment for the center.	Bishop CA	\$205
Del Norte County Board of Supervisors	Funding would go towards renovating the Del Norte County Jail, which was built in 1963. Due to heightened security and outdated facilities, the jail currently lacks enough visitation, recreation, and program space to address inmates' needs. Specifically, funding would be used to remodel an existing recreation room to address security concerns and update an existing booking area to create an additional three recreation rooms.	Crescent CA	\$3,080
Los Amigos de Guadalupe	This project would restore the park to be able to provide the community facility that the LeRoy family intended the park to be in 1871. LeRoy Park and the community center was the community unofficial town square where community events and family activities have occurred for generations. LeRoy Park and its community center have long served as the town's nucleus, hosting events ranging from quinceañeras, barbecues, outdoor concerts and car shows to the Comité Cívico Mexicano de Guadalupe's annual "Fiestas Patrias" celebrating Mexican Independence Day each September. The park has been a popular site for family gatherings, cultural/national holidays, or other community events like easter egg hunts and boy scout campouts for decades. This park is rooted in the community and has decades of history providing a community focused gathering spot and public benefits to the residents.	Guadalupe CA	\$1,700
County of Mariposa	Funding is requested to build a new garage shelter for a new National Park Service (NPS) owned ambulance. For many years, Mariposa County agreed to house an NPS ambulance in the Wawona area of Yosemite National Park on the condition that it would serve both the emergency healthcare needs of Wawona and Yosemite West residents as well as park visitors in Mariposa Grove, Wawona, and Glacier Point. Recently, Yosemite replaced its 1985 ambulance with a new, upgraded model. Unfortunately the new model does not fit in the current shelter so it must be parked in the Valley, adding 45 minutes or more to respond to emergency situations in the southern portion of the Park. County of Nevada	Funds would go towards installing a 330,000-gallon water storage tank, pipeline, and fire hydrants in the downtown core of North San Juan, which currently lacks public water service and an emergency water pipeline for fire suppression.	Nevada CA	\$1,050
