City of Huntington Beach	Requested funding would go toward establishing a mobile crisis response program to swiftly address mental health, substance abuse, and similar 911 calls for service in the field. A social worker and medical professional will address these calls in a properly equipped van to provide mental health assessments, interventions, transportation to facilities when needed, and basic first aid. MemorialCare Health System	The requested funding would allow Miller Children's and Women's Hospital to move the obstetrics clinic to a larger space and to integrate the clinic into the electronic health record. City of Los Angeles	The funding requested would be used to provide a community-based, health centered alternative to certain 911 emergency calls that might otherwise be routed to local law enforcement agencies. This would be accomplished by dispatching trained specialists in mental health, substance abuse, and other non-emergency medical fields to allow for de-escalation of a situation, and allow for the compassionate and effective treatment for the individuals in crisis.
